# From the Rabb.

Probably the most overlooked of the major holidays is *Shavu'ot*, the Feast of Weeks. Though it is one of the three pilgrimage festivals (*Pesach* and *Sukkot* are the others) when our ancestors used to trek from all over the ancient world to the Temple in Jerusalem for its celebration, this holiday always seems to come after the school year is out. This means that our religious school children seldom get to learn about it, and many adults seem to skip it, too, since it is at such a hectic time of year as people transition from spring to summer, and many already have their minds on escaping the Texas heat.

As with all of the pilgrimage festivals, *Shavu'ot* has an agricultural theme, a historical theme, and a spiritual theme. *Shavu'ot* also has other names just like its sister holidays. *Chag Habikurim* is the name that indicates the agricultural theme. It means holiday of the first fruits, signifying the beginning of the harvest season. The name Feast of Weeks comes because it marks the end of a daily countdown that begins on the second day of Passover. The counting was accomplished by bringing a certain measure of grain, called *omer*, to the Temple each day. When they had 49 measures (7 times seven weeks), they knew the next day would be *Shavu'ot*.

The historical theme is seen in the name *Z'man Matan Torateinu* -- the Time of the Giving of our Torah. Though not likely accurate, tradition holds that this is the day we gathered at Mt. Sinai and together witnessed the revelation of the Torah. The countdown of the omer, then, was also a countdown from slavery to the time when we really became the Jewish peoplehood by receiving the laws that would guide our Jewish way of living together.

Lastly, our spiritual theme is actually a combination of the other two themes. On Shavu'ot, we celebrate the learning of *Torah* as our way of connecting with God. Many

congregations have a tradition of holding a *Tikun*, an all-night study session to show symbolically that our love for the study of *Torah* should never end. We also have a tradition of eating dairy foods, such as blintzes and cheesecake, not so much for the milk as for the sweetness, so that we associate learning with a sweet taste in our mouths. This is reminiscent of the tradition of putting a drop of honey on the books of first year school students, so they would always think of learning as sweet.

This year, we will be having *Shavu'ot* services on Tuesday <u>evening</u>, <u>June 7</u>, at 8:00 p.m., and Wednesday at 9:30 a.m. on June 8. Remember that June 8 will also include a Yizkor service (in the main sanctuary) around 10:45 a.m. As you will note, this is a change from our tradition of the past. In all Orthodox congregations in this country, and in many Conservative congregations, the pilgrimage festivals have two days of yom tou (yuntiff) at the beginning and end of the holiday (or just 2 days for Shauu'ot). But in all movements in Israel, and in other Conservative congregations, only one day is observed at the beginning and end. The Religious Committee has decided that we are at a point of concern about trying to make too many *minuanim*, and at a point where the centrality of Israel to the Jewish Peoplehood is firmly established. Thus, we are following the Israeli model of one day only of yom tov for the holidays. Please note that in Israel, as in all Conservative congregations, there are two days of Rosh Hashanah.

I hope you will take the opportunity, Eat (michiks), Pray (the holiday services), and Love (the study of Torah) with us at each of these services that you are able to attend. This way, you can help make sure that *Shavu'ot* is no longer the forgotten holiday.

#### HOW TO OBSERVE THE YAHRZEIT

The light of the flame rekindles all the warm memories of the moment we shared together, and reassures me /us that a piece of his/her soul dwells in my/our heart(s) forever. May his/her soul be bound up with the bonds of eternal life. Amen. Candles are available at the Gift Shop. Every effort should be made to say Kaddish at congregational services. It is meritorious to perform some Mitzvah or to contribute to the Synagogue in commemoration of the deceased.
