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From the Rabb.

The reading of the Torah is the central piece of the entire worship service during certain days. Instituted by Ezra back in the 5th century B.C.E., the public reading of the Torah takes place every Monday, Thursday, and holiday. Mondays and Thursdays were chosen because they were the public market days, ensuring not only a *minyan*, but the largest possible gathering to hear these holy words.

We often forget that Shabbat is a holiday; it's just one that comes every week. And Rosh Chodesh is considered a kind of half holiday – it's special, but we don't have to stop working for it. The other annual holidays – Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Pesach, Shavu'ot, and Sukkot – round out when we read the Torah publicly (with one or two other exceptions).

Most of us know that we read one portion of the Torah each week, called the sidrah, from the word seder, meaning order, or parashah, meaning chapter or section (parshat hashauu'a = the weekly portion). But fewer know when it is that we change from one to the next. The answer is at Shabbat afternoon services called Minchah (which we no longer do at our congregation). This is the first time of the week we read a given portion of the Torah. Usually, the first Aliyah of the full Torah reading is divided into three smaller aliyot.

The word "Aliyah" means "going up", for it is considered going up in holiness, and therefore an honor, to be called up to the Torah. In Jewish tradition, many people make a donation to the congregation as a way of showing gratitude for such an honor, and of fulfilling the mitzvah of giving tzedakah. When one is called up to the Torah, a gabbai is supposed to ask if you'd like to make a donation. If you say yes, s/he will ask how much and note that by slipping a disc showing that amount into a card with your

name on it. These cards are kept in a box and used by the *gabbai* on the right side of the Torah reader (even if the gabbai doesn't ask, a donation is a good way to show thanks for the honor). The box is left in the office after services so these donations may be recorded. A typical donation is \$5 or \$10 for people who are called up regularly. But special occasions and/or requesting a *mishebeirach* (a special blessing) for a particular occasion or request would justify a higher donation. Some of our more senior members have been known to be called up for their birthdays and donate a dollar for every year of their age!

The Monday and Thursday readings and Rosh Chodesh also get three aliyot just like on Shabbat afternoon. On Shabbat morning, a minimum of seven aliyot are called, and then the Maftir. Additional aliyot, each one called hosafah, may be added, but no fewer than seven should be read. On all other holidays it's five aliyot, except six for Yom Kippur, with a seventh added if it also falls on Shabbat.

The tradition is to give the first to a Kohein, or priest, and the second to a Levite, and all others to Israelites. If there's no Kohein, we call a Levi bimkom (in place of a) Kohein. The reason they get the first one or two aliyot is simple, but not well known. Apparently, there was significant bickering over who got the first aliyah, and so to preserve peace in the community, it was decided that a kohein should always be first.
